The DAAD organizes Summer Course Grants that enable students to take intensive language and cultural courses at German universities. The DAAD Alumni Association was happy to provide the funds for **Priscilla Sanchez** and **Mark Elyse** to spend a summer improving their German language skills.

Eleventh years ago the DAAD instituted summer RISE grants. (Research Internships in Science and Engineering). Aside of the DAAD itself, several organisations help sponsor the total of over 300 scholarships for students from the USA, Canada, Great Britain and other countries. The DAAD Alumni Association USA congratulates six grantees to their selection from a very competitive process. Our grants are earmarked to support environmental research. Cyrus Belenky, Natalie Isenberg, Kyungjoo Park, Jia-Ahn Pan, Jisheng Zhang, and Sara Sand went to German universities to work with German PhD candidates on projects as diverse as "Photocatalytic Wastewater Treatment with Unsteady Process Conditions" and "MOF-coating on ceramic foams for Energy Storage".

The European Refugee Crisis *By Board member Sigrid Berka*

Rhode Island, October 8, 2015

The event was part of **German Campus week** to celebrate **25 years of German Unification**. My colleagues and I from URI's German Section felt that we could not

celebrate without also addressing **THIS crisis of historical proportions** affecting **Germany** right now, and all of **Europe** for that matter and, of course, large parts of the **Middle East** from where the majority of migrants originate. Fortunately we could convene a panel of experts, which shed light

onto the topic from diverse viewpoints. There were 80 people in the audience among them our DAAD ISAP scholars from the TU Braunschweig. This made for a lively discussion afterwards. Speakers were:

Michael Honhart - a Professor in our History department whose research centers on Modern Germany and European nationalism. He viewed the crisis from a historical perspective, defining what it meant and means to be "German". He contributed his thoughts about refugee, immigration, and asylum issues in past decades.

Katrin Joma – Assistant Professor, Departments of Political Science and Philosophy. Her research is interdisciplinary between the fields of religion and political science. She focuses on the relationship between religion and politics in Muslim majority countries. She talked about how the crisis started in Syria, how it is continuing, and also how it is a global political matter with several countries involved, not just pertaining to Syria.

Norbert Hedderich - a Professor of German and Chair of the Department of Modern & Classical Languages and Literature. He had been following the news about the refugee crisis, both in the German and in the U.S press very closely, and summarized the German response and its reception world-wide.



THE EUROPEAN REFUGEE CRISIS



Ric McIntyre - Professor of Economics put the discussion into the context of the colonial and post-colonial history of south west Asia and American policy there. He claimed that there is no European crisis when we put this one in perspective when compared with other real crises on the globe. He focused on Afghanistan, the second largest source of refugees, and on Iraq.
